





## Oaty Delights


### Ingredients







## GILL'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH

### Creme Brulee

- 3 egg yolks
- 2 ozs caster sugar
- 1/2 pt single cream
- Demerara sugar

### Method

Break egg yolks in a basin and blend thoroughly with the sugar.

Bring cream almost to the boil, pour slowly on to the egg yolks stirring all the time.

Strain the custard into a shallow china dish which has been well buttered and place in a Bain Marie or water bath.

Place in an oven on a low heat (gas 2, 150c) and bake for 45 minutes, cool the custard and then allow to chill.

About an hour before serving, sprinkle the top with brown sugar and brown quickly under pre-heated grill. Turn the dish to allow even browning.

When cold the sugar will be crisp, serve with fresh strawberries or raspberries and pouring cream. Delicious!

# ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR (LEST WE FORGET)

## June/July

### From the Parish Magazine

"*British Red Cross* – It is requested that all the work that is now being finished be returned to Skisdon on or before June 18<sup>th</sup>. There has been sent from head-quarters considerable more work to be done and workers are earnestly asked for. We understand that owing to the great fighting now going on, and the number of wounded, great demands are being made for these articles."

It should be remembered that although the major battles are well recorded, there were many minor skirmishes that were recorded but didn't attract as much attention in the press. Remember also that our boys from St Kew were involved in many of these major battles and side-shows, and were wounded. In order to save paper, the July 1917 edition of the St Kew Parish Magazine included St Endellion Parish News.

### United States Forces

On 13<sup>th</sup> June (before he headed for the Western Front) General Pershing, the head of the American Expeditionary Force, visited Paris where he was given an ecstatic welcome by its citizens. Before 1917 the United States had never participated in European politics, nor had it ever fought a major war outside North America. On 25<sup>th</sup> June General Pershing greeted the first troops to land in France as they stepped ashore.

### Western Front

In the first 6 months on the Western Front the Allies claimed to have brought down 1,401 German aircraft and 52 kite balloons, while the Germans claimed to have destroyed 955 British aircraft and 45 kite balloons.

### Messines

Messines was a vantage point on the Flanders plain, held by the Germans from late 1914. It proved impervious to conventional Allied assault; consequently, it was decided to tunnel under Messines and to detonate mines. British, Australian and Canadian tunnelers worked for a year to dig these mines and place 600 tons of explosives. On the eve of the battle General Plumer stated: "*Gentlemen, we may not make history tomorrow, but we will certainly change the geography.*" History was made and the geography of the land was changed. The battle of Messines started on 7<sup>th</sup> June and at 3.10am nineteen mines were blown. Apparently, the detonation was felt as far away as southern England. The initial detonation was followed by an artillery barrage and an all-out infantry attack. A German counter attack failed. The battle of Messines concluded on 14<sup>th</sup> June, and was considered a major success in spite of incurring over 26,000 British, Australian and New Zealand casualties. It was estimated that over 10,000 German troops were killed and 7,000 taken prisoner.

It was on 7<sup>th</sup> June 1917 that William John Crahart of Treharrock Farm was killed serving with the Auckland Regiment of the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces. He was born at Lanteglos, son of John and Annie Crahart. The family moved to Treharrock where, in 1911, John was Cow Man, and William was Horse Man. William was brother of Fred (who was killed at Vimy Ridge on 28<sup>th</sup> April 1917), Thomas, Bessie, Ethel, Ernest, Samuel and Elizabeth. He is related to Fred Crahart who lives at Highway.

### Flowers, Festival and Felicity

Were you lucky enough to find your way to the St Kew Flower Festival? If so, you will no doubt understand my enthusiasm for what the community of St Kew gave us. While contemplating this, I came across these words in a prayer of Thomas Traherne's: Is not sight a jewel? Is not hearing a treasure? Is not speech a glory?

Thomas Traherne was a poet, priest and mystic who grew up at the time of the Restoration. Born in 1636, he died aged 37. In his short life he searched for something more than what his Puritan education and the impact of the Cromwellian period gave him; and found it when he moved to the country. Before that he said he was "swallowed up in the miserable gulf of idle talk and worthless vanities. I lived among dreams and shadows, like a prodigal son feeding upon husks with swine."

But then, on moving to the country, he comes to himself and resolves to spend all of his time in search of what he calls "felicity", happiness, and to be guided by 'an implicit faith in 'God's goodness'.

Flower festivals offer us a special time to reflect on God's glory. It was there at St Kew. Each arrangement was inspired by a poem, beautifully written out, alongside. One could marvel at the time, ingenuity, creativity and thought given to illustrate each poem. Our hear-

ing, blessed by the evocative sound of the piano as we walked round, was crowned on the Sunday with the buoyant voices of the Tintagel Male Voice Choir. The natural beauty of the flowers enhanced the poetry, the music enhanced our enjoyment, and the stewards warmed our hearts by their presence and welcome.

But that is not all. For home-made cakes, quiches and cream teas were offered in the hall as well! (Traherne leaves out the joy of the palate!). A complete community enterprise and balm to the soul.

In his prayer, quoted above, Thomas Traherne goes on to say, "O my Lord, pardon my ingratitude and pity my dullness who art not sensible of these gifts. The freedom of thy bounty hath deceived me. These things were too near to be considered. Thou presented me with thy blessings, and I was not aware".

But In St Kew, in those few days in May, it was as if Love bade us welcome to appreciate the wonder of what surrounds us, and how the truth of God can be made known to us, by the loving gestures of a community working together to help us realise afresh the blessings of God's inestimable favours.


