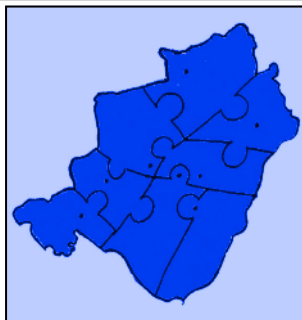

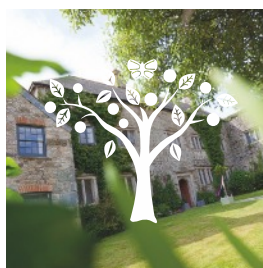

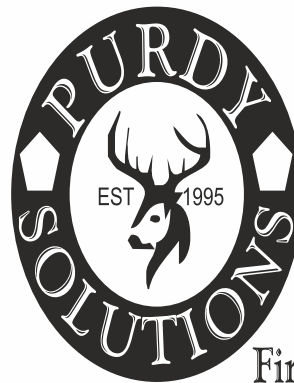

We are looking forward to a wonderful term of activities where the children will **Discover, Learn and Develop**. If you haven't seen the sign near the Tesco store, please do have a look: it really captures the feelings of our children when they are at school.

NEW TOPICS

With the beginning of the Summer Term, as always, we have new Topics being studied in each of the classes. The **Pre-School** and **Class 1** will be continuing to look at their topic from last term (there's just so much to learn!): **Ground, Air and Water** and will be taking a journey up the beanstalk from Jack and the Beanstalk, sharing in a Commotion in the Ocean to learn about sea creatures and flying high with The Blue Balloon. We couldn't miss the opportunity of learning some science with Jack and the Beanstalk and have already planted beans – we will be looking after these to ensure they have the right growing conditions. **Class 2** will be investigating the question "**Are Bugs Important?**" They have made an excellent start by asking many interesting "I wonder.....?" questions, exploring the school grounds to locate a suitable site for a "bug hotel" and have created a collage of Spring from the school grounds and fantastic designs for the hotels. They will be working collectively to create a deluxe one! 'Caterpillar Shoes' and the film 'A Bug's Life' will inspire character descriptions and reports on a bug of their choice. **Class 3** will be developing entrepreneurial skills: being challenged to develop a business idea. They will manufacture a product, market it and calculate the costings so they can attempt to make a profit. All of the businesses will be based on life in the outdoors. These can be either equipment for an activity in the outdoors or something grown outside. We are fortunate to have such a fantastic outdoor area at the school and plan on using it to the maximum to get our budding entrepreneurs growing, making and selling!

WORLD BOOK DAY

An amazing selection of characters were seen at the

St Kew version of World Book Day on 9th March. The children thoroughly enjoyed the day's events based around famous authors: Julia Donaldson - making Stick Man, Roald Dahl - making chocolate and Alex Rider - with a TOP SECRET mission. With a Fancy Dress competition and book swap to finish things off, Harmony, Morley, Zienna and Nathan were rewarded for their character costumes of Gangsta Granny, Saucepan Man, Pocahontas and Diary of a Wimpy Kid respectively – their costumes looked amazing! A HUGE thank you to Miss Osborne and the Librarians for organising such a wonderful selection of book activities.

READING IS FUNDAMENTAL!

We delighted in three tea parties in the Spring Term with an amazing 99% of children having received at least one reading reward. An Afternoon of Books and Cakes allows children to enjoy hearing stories friends have read, a homemade cake (the type differing at each one!) and a drink – Reading at St Kew is not just FUNDamental, it is FUN!!!

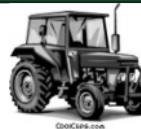

St Endellion Easter Festival: A Tale of Two Concerts

Recently we have been treated to two remarkable music concerts:

The first, on Thursday 5th April, was a St. Kew Church Lunchtime Prom featuring the renowned pianist, Viv McLean, in a Chopin recital.

For well over an hour he held a packed audience spellbound, as he beautifully and tenderly explored four of Chopin's twenty-one Nocturnes. Interspersing these were two Ballades, (the No.3 and the No.1) and the dramatic and lyrical Scherzo in B-flat minor.

It was an afternoon to savour and showed just why he has been described as 'a poet of the key-board'. Some of his recordings are available and well worth the search.

The second concert took place as the finale of the Easter Festival at St. Endellion Church on Sunday 8th April. This was a terrific performance of Frideric Handel's, 'The Messiah'.

Brilliantly conducted by David Watkin, both the orchestra, chorale and four soloists gave a powerful and deeply-felt interpretation of this master-work. It was all the more special special in that it was performed specifically 'in memoriam' for Bridget 'Biddy' Holden, who passed away in late December. As well as being a foremost painter and local artist, Biddy had also been one of the key founding organisers of the St. Endellion Festival.

It was appropriate, therefore, that the concert was preceded by a moving tribute to Biddy from her friend and festival organiser, Frances Hickox.

St Kew Historical Society Hidden Industrial Archaeology of St Kew - a guided walk around Tregildrans Quarry

Thursday 12th April - a warm & sunny spring evening saw an enthusiastic group of around 2 dozen members and guests attend this most interesting and informative excursion.

By kind permission of Cornish Tipi Holidays & Weddings, the group explored the largest quarry in the parish (now a peaceful woodland lake) and learnt about our earlier quarrying, mining & railway heritage. A very well presented and researched talk (supplemented by a tithe map, field map and several historical photographs) was given by Kim Appleby, our Archivist and founder, along with anecdotes from Juliet Cleave (née Tom) whose father and

grandfather owned and operated the quarry, and Jim Godden who has extensively researched its history (see his publication 'The Parish of St Kew: People and Places in The History of St Kew'.)

This was an extremely entertaining and fun evening enjoyed by all and a 1½ hour walk up hill and down dale was certainly good exercise!

Thank you for your support for this and other Historical Society events, they are interesting, entertaining and informative.

The View from the Allotments

..... and yes! There is progress at last!

I was beginning to think that we should never have the chance to get digging or seeding or planting this year – or at least, not until mid-summer! But suddenly the site has begun to look a little more tended and cared-for and I am feeling altogether more positive.

We asked Graham Tiplady to bring his heavy-duty rotavator onto the site – it looks like a mini-tractor and makes short work of turning over heavy ground which has been left for some months, not to mention the weeds which have still been growing, despite frost and snow.

Anyway, we first wanted to turn over the four plots which are vacant, so that they would at least look a bit more inviting for anyone who wanted to take them over. We also offered the chance to tenants to have their own plots rotavated at the same time. It can be really hard work with the ground as water-laden it is and is a back-breaking job, even when one is young and fit (which a lot of us aren't!). We took the opportunity and Graham has cleared one of our two small plots. The other one we didn't want to touch as it has asparagus beds, strawberry plants and fruit bushes.

Obviously, it will need to be gone over again with a smaller machine and then raked over to produce what my father used to call a "fine tilth" and THEN I can put in my onions. We had such a brilliant crop

last year (won a first and a second at the Parish Show) that I am anxious to get going before too long. In previous years I have always got the onions in before the end of March, but not this year. Keeping fingers crossed, but I reckon onions and other plants will catch up later so there's no point in worrying.

There are now plans to get a skip on site to get rid of all the rubbish which has accumulated over the past two years. Within the month, it should all look much tidier and more welcoming.

Back at home, Tony has filled a big covered seed-tray with cosmos (which we love), cavolo nero (a posh cabbage), red curly kale and sprouts while at the greenhouse at the allotment, he has a tray each of leeks and broad beans. It's a start.

The trouble is, even when we have a few hours dry, the weather has been so cold and grey and gloomy that we don't feel like going outside! There are plenty of little jobs I could be doing out at the front of the house, and a lot of tidying up too, but I feel completely disincentivised (if there is such a word). Sunshine would make all the difference. Or is that just an excuse?

We've still got four vacant plots by the way, so do ask if you would like to see them (now dug over and rotavated and a much more attractive proposition).

GILL'S RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Rogan Josh Pasta

A fast and fabulous version of the traditional Indian lamb stew.

Ingredients

- 250g dried or fresh Tagliatelle, kettle full of boiling water
- Low fat cooking spray
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 400g lean lamb mince
- 2 tablespoons Rogan Josh curry paste
- 300g passata
- 175g cherry tomatoes halved
- 2 tablespoon fresh chopped coriander.

Method

- Put the tagliatelle into a saucepan and cover with boiling water, bring to the boil and simmer for 10 -12 minutes until al dente.

- Meanwhile, heat a lidded non-stick saucepan and spray with cooking fat. Cook the onion for 3 minutes or until beginning to soften.
- Add the lamb mince and curry paste and cook on high for 1 minute, stirring constantly.
- Stir in the passata and cherry tomatoes and bring to the boil. Cover and simmer gently for 5 minutes.
- Drain the pasta and add to the lamb sauce along with the coriander. Toss to coat and serve immediately.

Variation: Replace the lamb mince with vegetarian mince if preferred.

ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR (LEST WE FORGET)

April/May 1918

Home Front

On 18 May, the British launched the first retaliatory air raid on German towns by bombing Cologne by day. The following day, the largest (and what would be the last) German night raid on London killed 49 and injured 177 civilians. The total number of civilian casualties from air raids since 1915, within the London Metropolitan Police District, was 668 killed and 1,938 injured. Londoners had every reason to believe they were on the front line.

On 19 May, the German also dropped bombs on British Camps and hospitals at Etaples with heavy casualties. Etaples was the location for a large (and infamous) training and rehabilitation depot in northern France.

Western Front

After the cessation of the recent German offensive on 30 April, four battle-weary British Divisions were 'resting', in a sector near the River Aisne, detached from the rest of the Army. They were recuperating but also guarding the trench line. On 25 May the French HQ reported that there were no indications of an enemy attack in the Aisne area. However, on the morning of 27 May 1918 the Germans began a bombardment and the British suffered heavy losses; this was followed by a poison gas drop. Once the gas had lifted, the Germans attacked. The Allies were taken by surprise and the Germans advanced through a 40-kilometre gap in the Allied lines.

During this period, the US Forces were ordered to take Cantigny on 28 May. This was the first offensive action of the war by the 28 Infantry Regiment (The Big Red One). They succeeded quite swiftly but lost 522 men killed or wounded. German coun-

ter attacks were ineffective. However, on 29 May the Germans launched a major offensive on the Aisne front. Soissons fell and the French government was preparing to flee Paris. Reserves from every quarter were rushed to the front to meet the threat. Included was the US 2 Division, which went into position north-west of Chateau Thierry near a patch of forest – Belleau Wood. More about Belleau Wood next month.

The Germans smashed through the Allied Divisions, capturing over 50,000 Allied soldiers by 30 May. It was here that the 2nd Battalion, the Devonshire Regiment (2 Devons), earned everlasting glory and a citation in the French Orders of the Day, by sacrificing themselves almost to a man in their stand.

It was during this Battle of Aisne, that 45606 Private Richard Henry Andrew of the 2 Devons was killed on 31 May 1918, aged 26. He is commemorated not only our War Memorial but also on the Soissons Memorial, located on the banks of the River Aisne. He was born at Chapel Amble in 1892, the son of William Willcocks Andrew and Thirza Ann Andrew (formerly Bassett) who was born at St Columb in 1850 and was buried at St James Churchyard on 11 January 1918. William, a highway labourer, born 1845, died at Hustyn Mill, St Breock on 11 February 1923. The father of William was John Andrew who married Jane Woolcock of Endellion, in St James Church, St Kew, on 22 July 1833 (both signed the register with "their mark"). John died 10 April 1870 at the Union Workhouse at Bodmin, and Jane died 16 August 1875 at Trequite, St Kew.

Richard Henry was brother to Susan, Richard, Mary, Jane, Elizabeth, John, Ada and William, and husband of Lilian Andrew (Kendall) whom he married on 25 July 1912, of Amble Street, St Kew (in the next house to Percy May who died on 8 August 1917). Lilian was born in 1890 and her father was Thomas, a farm labourer, and mother Mary Jane. She had a brother William, and sisters: Annie, Bessie and Marian – all the family were born at St Kew.

Richard Henry and Lilian had a son, Thomas, who was born 29 December 1912 and who married Marjorie Jan Power in 1938. Thomas and Marjorie had two girls: Valerie Ann, born 1943, and Lorna Joan, born 1945. A relative, David Andrews, a frequent visitor to this area, continues with the family history.

From Scott Mann MP

I was delighted to meet with Cornwall's Girl Guides last month during their annual celebration event at the Royal Cornwall Showground. The event highlighted the great achievements of the Girl Guides over the past 12 months and to commend those who help such a wonderful organisation. The Girl Guides do terrific work in bringing young people together to learn new skills and to socialise with others. Skills that are learnt through the Girl Guides as well as the Scouts, Cubs and Beavers can last with you forever, and it was great to meet with the Girl Guides and talk about what they've been learning and how they've helped their local communities.

The Showground also held a Farm and Country Day event the same week where schools came to learn about agriculture and country life.

This is a fantastic initiative which teaches children about where their food comes from and the benefits of good animal husbandry. Unfortunately there are a lot of scare stories in parts of the media which try to paint our agricultural sector in a bad light, and these events help to bust those myths by championing the high animal welfare standards that we have in the UK and how farmers look after their livestock.

The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) just recently published its proposals for a post-Brexit agricultural policy, and I have spoken with the Environment Secretary to give my feedback. This includes encouraging farmers to engage with schools by

holding educational visits and to have more of an input in managing public rights of way.

We have many paths around the countryside which need managing, and I think part of the future farming subsidy should include the upkeep of public rights of way so that people can enjoy the countryside, as well as farmers having the ability to move paths which hinder their farming.

The Government's proposals are open for public consultation and can be found on the DEFRA website.

DEFRA has also confirmed that it will be launching a bottle deposit return scheme to increase recycling rates and tackle plastic pollution, which I greatly welcome. Schemes like this already exist in Denmark, Sweden and Germany, where consumers are rewarded with cash or vouchers when returning plastic bottles or metal containers to local shops.

There is currently a big shift in attitudes towards plastic and the development of a scheme like this couldn't come at a better time. The UK is becoming more conscious about the effects of plastic waste, but there is more to do and I think deposit return schemes are a huge step in protecting the environment.

Here in the South West we all too often see the impact of plastic pollution on our beaches and in our seas, and I want to commend the hard work of campaign groups throughout the region who have been working to clean up their local areas and raise public awareness about plastic waste, including Bude Cleaner Seas and Surfers Against Sewage.

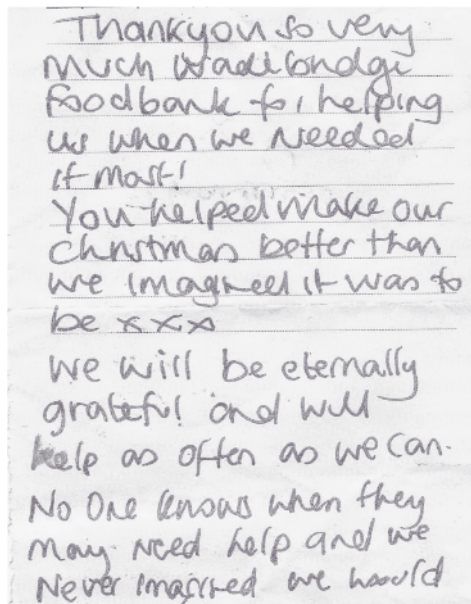

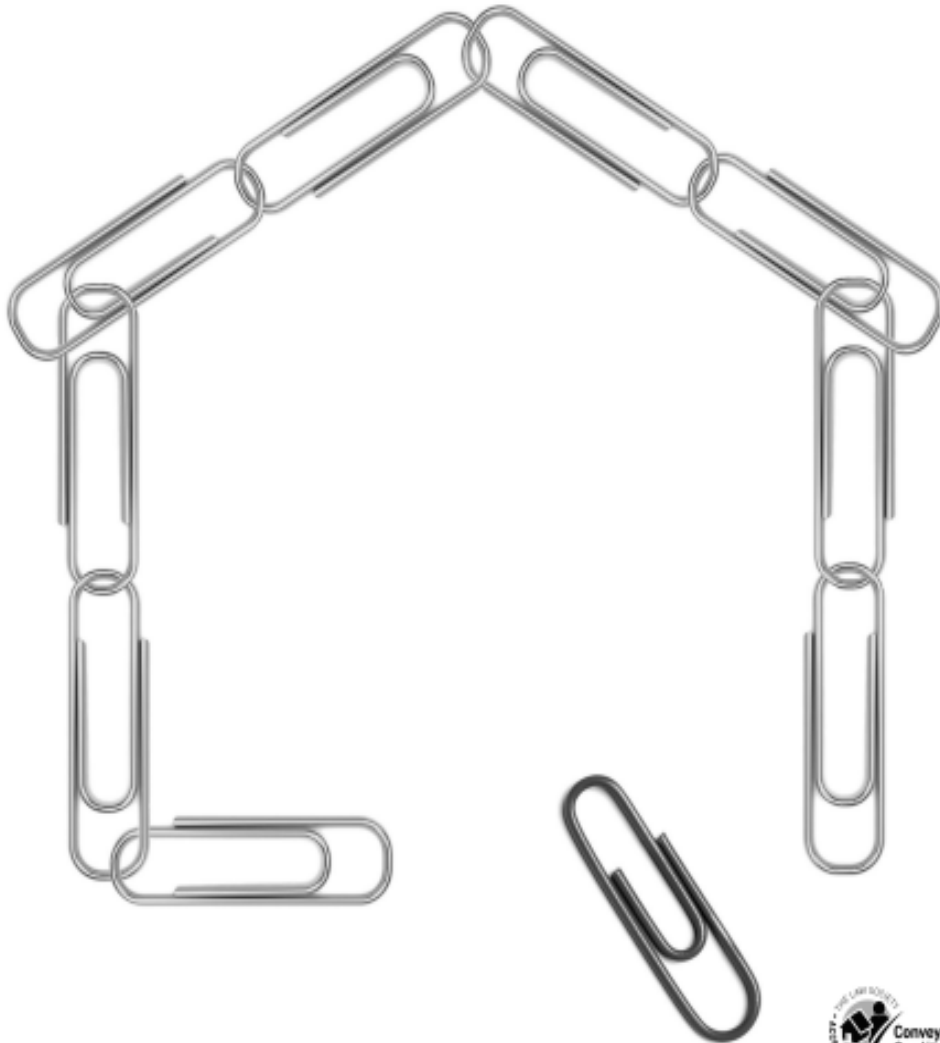
